A BILL

To change the calendar period of the Federal fiscal year.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 4 This Act may be cited as the "It's About Time Act". SEC. 2. CHANGE OF FISCAL YEAR. 6 (a) IN GENERAL.— 7 (1) CHANGE OF CALENDAR PERIOD.—Section 1102 of title 31, United States Code, is amended— 8 (A) by striking "October 1" and inserting 9

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"January 1"; and

1	(B) by striking "September 30 of the fol-
2	lowing year" and inserting "December 31 of
3	that year".
4	(2) Effective date.—The amendments made
5	by paragraph (1) shall be effective on January 1,
6	2025.
7	(b) Transition to New Fiscal Year.—
8	(1) Transition period budget.—As soon as
9	practicable, the President shall prepare and submit
10	to Congress—
11	(A) after consultation with the Committees
12	on the Budget and the Committees on Appro-
13	priations of the House of Representatives and
14	the Senate, budget estimates for the Federal
15	government for the period commencing October
16	1, 2024, and ending on December 31, 2024, in
17	such form and detail as the President may de-
18	termine; and
19	(B) proposed legislation the President con-
20	siders appropriate with respect to changes in
21	law necessary to provide authorizations of ap-
22	propriations for that period.
23	(2) AGENCY TRANSITION.—The Director of the
24	Office of Management and Budget shall provide by
25	regulation, order, or otherwise for the orderly transi-

1	tion by all departments, agencies, and instrumental-
2	ities of the Federal government and the government
3	of the District of Columbia from the use of the fiscal
4	year in effect on the date of the enactment of this
5	Act to the use of the new fiscal year prescribed in
6	subsection (a). The Director shall prepare and sub-
7	mit to Congress such additional proposed legislation
8	as the Director considers necessary to accomplish
9	this objective.
10	(c) Conversion of Authorizations of Appro-
11	PRIATIONS.—Any law providing for an authorization of
12	appropriations commencing on October 1 of a year shall,
13	if that year is any year after 2024, be considered as mean-
14	ing January 1 of the following year. Any law providing
15	for an authorization of appropriations ending on Sep-
16	tember 30 of a year shall, if that year is any year after
17	2024, be considered as meaning December 31 of that year.
18	Any law providing for an authorization of appropriations
19	for the fiscal year 2025 or any fiscal year thereafter shall
20	be construed as referring to that fiscal year ending on De-
21	cember 31 of the calendar year having the same calendar
22	year number as the fiscal year number.
23	(d) TITLE OF APPROPRIATION ACTS.—

1	(1) In General.—Section 105 of title 1,
2	United States Code, is amended by striking "Sep-
3	tember 30" and inserting "December 31".
4	(2) Effective date.—The amendment made
5	by paragraph (1) shall be effective for any fiscal
6	year commencing on or after January 1, 2025.
