

FY2023 Intelligence Authorization Act Unclassified Highlights

Reporting Requirements:

- Requires each element of the Intelligence Community to submit annual unfunded priorities lists, giving Congress the power to decide whether to fund intelligence programs that the Administration failed to prioritize in the President's budget.
- Requires the President to annually submit the National Intelligence Priorities Framework.

Accountability and Oversight:

 Holds the Administration accountable to Congress by preventing funds from being spent until the delivery of numerous congressionally directed actions.

Modernization:

- Requires the Director of National Intelligence (DNI) to develop a plan to promote intelligence-related
 engineering, research, and development activities at minority-serving institutions to strengthen and
 sustain the IC.
- Provides agile acquisition authority to all IC elements and authorizes \$75 million for the DNI to enter into transactions to carry out research products.
- Creates a pilot program to transition promising developmental technology prototypes into production.
- Directs the DNI and Secretary of Defense to develop a plan to expand access to secure spaces for smalland medium-sized emerging technology companies to reduce barriers to working with the IC.

Countering Our Adversaries:

- Requires public reports exposing the wealth and corrupt activities of the leaders of the Chinese Communist Party.
- Requires public reports on the detention and forced labor camps in Xinjiang region of the People's Republic of China.
- Requires the designation of a lead IC coordinator to support accountability for Russian atrocities in Ukraine.
- Requires a coordinated IC effort to counter and neutralize the proliferation of Iran-origin unmanned aircraft systems, while intensifying cooperation with Israel.
- Requires reports on China's support to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, including any steps China has taken to help Russia's war effort.
